

***COVID-19 - CODE OF CONDUCT ON
PCYC PREMISES***

The following reflects the directives provided by the health authorities as of July 11, 2020. They may be revised from time to time as the situation evolves. PCYC will regularly communicate any changes as they become known.

1. WEAR A MASK on the premises when moving around
2. WASH YOUR HANDS coming in and out, before touching a cart, handle....
3. MAINTAIN SOCIAL DISTANCING at all times.

Bathroom

Floor markings have been made in the bathroom and only one member can enter the restroom at a time. The door will be locked and you will have to use the code to access (same door code as the one on Cartier). You are asked to come in from the regular entrance (east side) and exit through the west side. At the door before entering the bathrooms, call to find out if there is anyone in. Masks must be worn when moving around. The lockers, changing rooms and showers will not be accessible.

Guests

Please wait for them at the gate and accompany them to your boat and back to the gate when leaving. DO NOT give the gate code to your guests.

Since we have very limited services and space available (tables, chairs, BBQ) and we have to limit the number of people on the premises, guests will not have access to our terrace and amenities. We must reserve this space for our members.

Guests can use the chemical toilets that are made available by the city in the parking area to the north of the club (Lakeshore Avenue). Using your boat's barbecue is STRICTLY FORBIDDEN while at the dock.

Terrace

A sanitizer is provided so you can disinfect the chair's arms before sitting on the terrace or the veranda. The tables have been arranged according to health authorities' protocols. You may remove your mask while sitting. The 2-meter rule is in effect unless you are from the same household. Only members of the same household may sit together, or two members from a different household can sit at the same table provided that they are sitting one at either end (lengthwise).

Please wash or disinfect your hands before filling your water bottle at the fountain.

Two barbecues have been made available but you will need to bring your own plates, utensils, and tools. A list of takeout restaurants is also posted on the bar window.
