## PARTICIPATION POLICY

The safety of our participants is our number one priority!

To ensure the safety and well-being of all participants, Skippers and "designated crew members" are prohibited from participating in this event if they:

- 1. Have consumed alcohol prior to or during the event.
- 2. Are under the influence of any substances, including but not limited to marijuana.

We appreciate your cooperation in maintaining a safe and enjoyable environment for everyone.

## **RULES AND GUIDELINES**

- 1. Keelboats and powerboats are invited to participate.
- 2. There shall be a minimum of two souls onboard each boat, 2 of which must be adults.
- 3. Attending the Skipper Meeting is mandatory in order to review the guidelines and describe the routing we will cruise.
- 4. The cruise will last approximately 60 minutes at a planned speed of 2-3 knots.
- 5. Prepare your boats in daylight.
- 6. Participants must consult the *Transport Canada Safe Boating Guide* to ensure they have the required safety equipment, including navigation lights, tested and operational.
- 7. A VHF radio is required.
- 8. Lifelines must be attached.
- 9. When embarking and disembarking from the boat, be sure to have the boat's hull resting against your slip and the area well illuminated.
- 10. Life jackets must be worn by all onboard.
- 11. The Skipper of the boat must remain at the helm at all times.
- 12. Have a flashlight or headlamp for every crew member. Red lights are best to illuminate the cockpit. Don't over-illuminate your cockpit with a bright white light when on the water. Dim your navigation screens and cabin lights.
- 13. Leaving the cockpit to walk on the deck must be avoided, but should this be required for safety reasons, the crew member leaving the cockpit must be tethered to a safety line.
- 14. If the removal and installation of the fenders requires the crew to walk on deck, leave your fenders attached. If you don't want to drag 8 fenders through the water, reduce the number when prepping your boat.
- 15. Sailboats will cruise under power.
- 16. Review your MOB drill. Should we experience a MOB, don't rush to the MOB boat. This may prevent them from maneuvering or keeping the MOB in sight. Light up the search area with your lights without blinding the MOB boat.
- 17. Minimize the work required to put your boat away after returning. This is to limit movement on the boat decks and docks.
